Method selection



Abundance & Diagnostics:

- -Plethora of methods, each with pros & cons
- -Host/Pathogen-specific
- -Selection of method depends on:
 - objectives
 - o required geographical & temporal scale
 - o available resources

Method selection



Objectives:

- Harmonization for comparison purposes at large scale (geographically / timely)
- Pathogen & population monitoring for health surveillance

We want to generate data with the <u>same methods</u> in a <u>number of places</u> with a <u>limited effort</u>.

Method selection



Requirements for selection:

- Easy (available resources: people, time, money)
- Low cost
- Applicable in all regions
- Species/Pathogen-specific

- → Compromise between having it all and having nothing
- → More accurate methods can be additionally recommended/applied

Evaluation of harmonized protocols



Objectives:

- -Test harmonized protocols: applicable?
- -Demonstrate advantages of harmonization

Three host-pathogen "models":

- Wild boar Aujeszky disease virus
- Red fox Echinococcus multilocularis
- Small rodents Francisella tularensis
- → In 3 countries or more: already available or new data
 - ✓ Harmonized protocols
 - ✓ Any additional, more accurate data

External partners' contributions



WP1+2

Contribute to reviews and harmonized protocols
indicate weaknesses & strength, missing information

WP3

- Provide existing data from your country
- Collect new data following harmonized protocols

WP4

- Consider promoting method harmonization also beyond APHAEA: sooner or later, it may be invaluable
- Keep the network alive: propose, ask for and receive:
 - Lab capacity, collaborations
 - Reagents, control samples, etc
 - Expertise in various fields of wildlife health
